IV. New Business

A. Traffic concerns from Law Enforcement Agencies

Sgt. Sanchez stated his concerns regarding the traffic signal at Imperial Valley College and Aten Road mentioning the sensor timing appears to be delayed. Sgt. Sanchez continued reporting a high incidence of collisions at the intersection of State Route 7 (SR-7) and Menvielle Road and inquired about potential measures to improve safety.

Mr. Olmedo indicated that the developer responsible for the Maggio Road and SR-7 intersection improvements is nearing completion and is currently addressing punch list items. Sgt. Sanchez also asked whether the Department of Public Works (Department) could assist with traffic control during the holiday season, including the potential temporary closure of Menvielle Road. He added that the California Highway Patrol (CHP) is coordinating with Caltrans for Caltrans to manage traffic operations on SR-7.

Mr. Olmedo responded that the Department may be able to support traffic control efforts by staging traffic control devices; however, he noted the Department may not have the capacity to provide traffic control personnel.

B. Traffic concerns from Engineering Agencies

Mr. Olmedo reported that the developer responsible for improvements at State Route 86 (SR-86) and Pitzer Road has tentatively scheduled improvements to occur mid-February 2026.

Mr. Olmedo continued that the Department is still working on the sight distance issue at the intersection of Heber Avenue and Correll Road. He noted that the State enacted Assembly Bill 413 which would establish “No Parking” zones within 20 feet of crosswalks and would allow the Department to mark red curbs.
